We have just experienced a disaster to our community that has tested our county's citizens and resources. After days of flooding, the sun peaked out today and found us still here. That says so much about our community. Seeing our citizens come together with our first responders to make sure all of our neighbors remain safe and have immediate needs met, is a testament to our resilience.

We now begin the process for recovery of Llano County. Crews have started performing damage assessments and coordinating with volunteer and governmental groups to assist our citizens directly in the coming days and weeks. We will see volunteers coming in to help with cleaning up our community and providing needed supplies. Various governmental agencies may come to Llano County and assist with funds, claims to property and other necessary items.

While our situation has seemed dire in the past few days, our county has survived, and we will continue to thrive. Homes and businesses will be repaired and rebuilt and most importantly our citizens will be provided necessary care.

Please be patient as we work through this difficult and trying process. One of the biggest challenges will be debris cleanup. While our various communities may have routine trash pick-up, the massive debris left as a result of this historic flood is outside our usual trash service contracts. Each of us must do our part to sort and move debris and ruined appliances to the road easement as part of the process. We have started crafting contracts and searching for appropriate debris removal contractors who can deal with the volume of debris in our communities and county. As soon as possible we will contract with an appropriate firm and the current piles of debris will be collected and discarded. However, it cannot be done in a few days. The process is cumbersome and may take weeks to complete.. Please know it is our highest priority and will be done as quickly as possible.

Recovery is a process but we intend to provide as many services as are needed and possible. It is our hope to make Liano County even stronger and more beautiful in the coming days.
