Summary:

This position is responsible for the enforcement of the animal control regulations adopted by the county and state law pertaining to rabies control and estray livestock; ensure that complaints are handled efficiently and effectively; educate the public in pet responsibility and ensure the protection and safety of animals and people in the county.

Essential Functions:

- Responds to routine inquiries and complaints concerning animal problems or violations
 of animal control ordinances, including but not limited to; animals running at large,
 bites, property damage, or injuries; maintains effective and efficient public relations
 when dealing with citizens
- Investigates violations of animal control ordinances and issue warnings or citations as required
- Investigates complaints of unwanted or escaped animals or those causing nuisances;
 captures and transports animals to the animal shelter
- Carries out duties in conformance with Federal, state, and county laws and regulations
- Coordinate investigative activities, provides mutual assistance during emergency situations and provides general information about Animal Control activities to the Chief Deputy
- Prepare and maintains records

Other Duties & Responsibilities:

- Adheres to safe work practices and procedures
- Regular attendance and adherence to work schedules is required; must be available after hours
- Maintains normal availability by radio or telephone for consultations on major emergencies or routine Animal Control questions
