

Proclamation
Child Abuse Awareness and Prevention Month
April 2023

WHEREAS, in Federal fiscal year 2022, the Texas Department of Family & Protective Services confirmed 273,415 victims of child abuse or neglect, including 70 in Llano County; and

WHEREAS, Hill Country Children's Advocacy Center interviewed 24 Llano County children for abuse in 2022; and

WHEREAS, currently there are 39 open court cases involving 61 Llano County children as of this day; and

WHEREAS, child abuse and neglect are a serious problem affecting every segment of our community, and finding solutions requires input and action from everyone in our community; and

WHEREAS, our children are our most valuable resources and will shape the future of Texas; and

WHEREAS, child abuse can have long-term psychological, emotional, and physical effects that can have lifelong consequences for victims, their families; and

WHEREAS, the impact of abuse and neglect has long-term personal, economic and social costs; therefore, hurting Texas' future; and

WHEREAS, protective factors are conditions that reduce or eliminate risk and promote the social, emotional, and developmental well-being of children; and

WHEREAS, effective child abuse prevention activities succeed because of the meaningful connections and partnerships created between child welfare, education, health, community- and faith-based organizations, businesses, and law enforcement agencies; and

WHEREAS, 9,590 CASA volunteers spoke up for the best interest of 23,943 children in Texas last year; and

WHEREAS, communities must make every effort to promote programs and activities that benefit children and their families; and

WHEREAS, Llano County is fortunate to have the caring members of the Llano County Child Welfare board who work toward improving the quality of lives of victims of child abuse; and

WHEREAS, we acknowledge that we must work together as a community to increase awareness about child abuse and contribute to promote the social and emotional well-being of children and families in a safe, stable, nurturing environment; and


WHEREAS, prevention remains the best defense for children and families; and

WHEREAS, Llano County Child Welfare Board, Child Protective Services, Child Advocacy Centers, foster parents, teachers and others work to ensure that children in our community have a safe, happy future; and

WHEREAS, on April 5, 2023 is "Go Blue Day" to support Child Abuse Awareness by wearing blue;

NOW, THEREFORE, We, Llano County Commissioners Court, do hereby proclaim April 2022 as NATIONAL CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH in Llano, Texas, Llano County, and urge all citizens to recognize this month by dedicating ourselves to the task of improving the quality of life for all children and families and by showing support on April 5, 2023 by wearing blue.


