Summary:

The purpose of this position is to answer calls for service as well as enforce traffic and penal code laws.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

- Patrol assigned areas of the Llano County
- Answer calls for service

- Complete reports in a timely manner
- Relay pertinent information related to Patrol (patrol issues, equipment needs and or failures) to Patrol Corporal

- Other duties or tasks assigned by supervisor
